

Home Learning Menu Term 5 - Troublesome Traders

Teachers provide a Home learning Menu at the start of each new term as a part of the Termly Curriculum Overview. We ask that children select at least one activity from the menu and either share on seesaw or bring into class during the last week of the term to share with the class and to celebrate.

Thinking as a Designer	Design your own soup recipe.	Create an African inspired stew.	Research how other cultures have inspired food choices in the UK.	If you were asked to design a Bristol inspired menu, what would it look like?
Thinking as a Scientist	Create a moon diary, detailing the phase of the moon each day.	Write an explanation text, explaining how we get day and night; and the seasons.	Research Isaac Newton and how he discovered gravity.	"A year is always 365 days." Discuss.
