<p>If you have access to sand, make a sand sculpture. Maybe you could have a competition between your family to see who could build the best sandcastle.</p>		<p>Use some old boxes, packaging or other materials to make a pirate accessory. It could be a treasure chest, a telescope, a sword or even a parrot.</p>	
<p>Learn some pirate songs – maybe your adult could film you singing them</p>		<p>Hide some 'treasure' in the house somewhere. Create a treasure map so your family can find it.</p>	
<p>Look at a map of the world – what countries can you find? What countries have your parents travelled to?</p>		<p>Use a gingerbread man recipe to make some pirate biscuits</p>
