## The Theme

The competition theme is 'Mutual Respect', which is set as one of the pillars of our British Values. There will be a selection of prizes and winners will be announced under each key stage of learning; from KS1 to KS5. Students have to make a response to the theme 'Mutual Respect' and perhaps look specifically at any of the suggested subheadings below:

### KS1 and 2

- Respect
- Kindness
- Helping others
- Listening
- Honesty

### KS3

In addition to the themes in the KS1& 2 categories you could also look at:

- Religion
- Culture
- Disability
- Hobbies and Interests

### KS4 and KS5

In addition to the themes in the KS1, 2 & 3 categories you could also look at:

- Mental Health
- Gender identity
- Sexual Orientation

## How to Enter

Students can submit an individual image or a series. Photographs can be either taken with a phone or camera but must be no more than 10MB, so it can be sent by email. All work should be submitted with a brief statement about what the work is about and how it relates to British Values.
