As artists we will ...

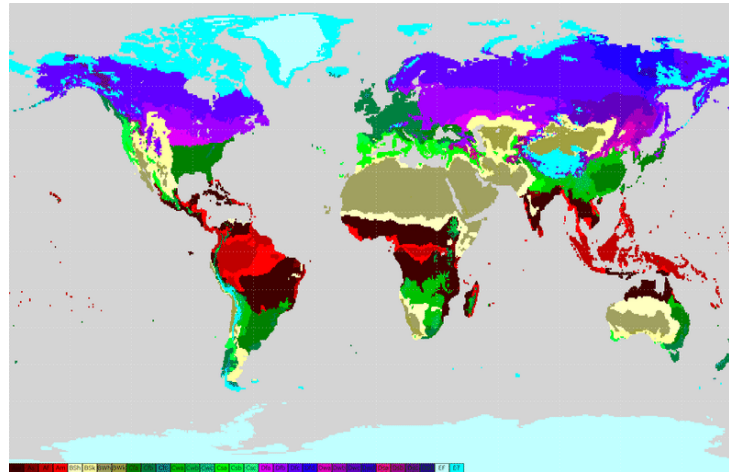
Collaging
